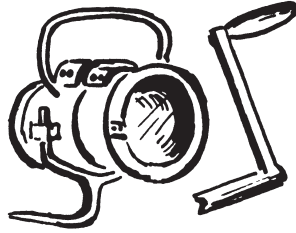

BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES JANUARY 2021 (Zoom Meeting)

Lester Manwiller gave the Treasurer's report for December 2020. A motion to accept the Treasurer's report was made by Barry Seel and seconded by Cheri Dotterer. The motion carried unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Membership: Phyllis Peters reported Donald Haines passed away on December 10, 2020. A sympathy card has been sent to the family from the club. Phone calls have been made to 20 people who did not renew. Ten people are not renewing. Phyllis has been unable to reach Carolyn Rahn. If anyone knows how to reach Carolyn, let Phyllis know. Hamburg Swap Meet: Lester said he talked to the person in charge of the Hamburg Field House and we are permitted to have the swap meet. He said the reptile show was held and in addition to masks and sanitizer they took everyone's temperature. In addition to masks and sanitizer Lester would like plexiglass at the admissions window with a slot to pass the money through. Lester asked if the club would still like to have the swap meet. Ken Dages thought we should hold off until we get shots because our age group is the most susceptible. Some members said they would help while others felt it was too risky. WHITEWALL TIRES

What does one do while stranded in the cabin in a blizzard...or just practicing in home isolation during a pandemic? I was spending an afternoon wandering through social networking sights looking for pictures of antique cars. Occasionally I would see a car sporting white wall tires! How long ago was that all the rage?

I can remember buying my first car. \$400, all the money a college sophomore could garner, bought me a 1957 Studebaker Commander. For those of you that can't

remember what one looked like, not the airplane nose of the early '50s but more like a '55 Chevy. But on steroids. The car needed tires badly, so off I went to the local tire retreader. No whitewalls or two weeks! I drove that car for two weeks on slick tires with the threads

showing because my first car was going to have whitewalls on it.

Whatever was the fascination with whitewalls? And who thought up that idea to color the side of the tires white? Well, good old Wikipedia solved the mystery. It seems rubber is naturally white and early cars used natural rubber for their tires, therefore the whole tire was white. But the rubber picked up stains from all the horse "stuff" on the roads and it was very hard to keep them clean. So the solution was to dye the tread area black. Yes, it wasn't that somebody came up with idea of white sidewalls rather someone came up with idea of black treads. Over time the white sidewall became narrower and narrower until sometime in the early '70s they just disappeared.

Why did we lose our fascination for whitewalls? I can remember thinking cars without them looked cheap. I think the last car I had with a sidewall decoration was a '69 Pontiac that had a red stripe on the tire. Have you ever considered putting white sidewalls on that antique in your garage?

TECH TALK ON TUNING

Our local MG club got a message from a former member who was packing up and moving to Florida. As all people in the antique car hobby he had accumulated a significant amount of spares and tools that he wanted to find a new home. Having just put new plugs, wires, points and condenser in the MGB I had found I no longer owned a timing light. I called the gentleman and asked if he had a timing light. He informed me that another gentleman in the club had "Claimed" everything to distribute to the club members but he would pull the timing light and any other things tuning related for me. When I went to pick up the timing light, he also had a compression gauge, an SU carburetor tuning tool and a Gunson's "Color Tune" tuning device.

I am not a gearhead and most of what I know about mechanics I taught myself over the last three years. I have seen pages of information in early issues of the New England MG T Registry's (NEMGTR) Sacred Octagon magazine about ignition timing including



enough charts to lull the biggest gearhead to sleep. Each chart for a different octane rating. But here was this little box that consisted of basically a spark plug replacement with a glass tube that allowed you to “see” the ignition inside the cylinder. Essentially you tune the engine until the explosion inside the cylinder goes from orange (too rich) to a “Bunsen Blue”; not a “Whiteish Blue” (too lean).

Now this is the 21st century. For \$100 I can buy a computer-based analyzer that can tell me the day that I switched my car from 87 octane to 93 octane. What is this color tune eyeball thing? Some kind of a joke? I imagined seeing an ad for this thing in a 1960 copy of Popular

Mechanics. Right next to the Johnny Atlas ad with the big brute kicking sand in the skinny kids face!

Well, thinking I’d get a laugh from my mechanic friends I showed this thing to them. To my surprise not only did they recognize it they also admitted to having used one! Apparently, this thing works! Then I thought about it, gas burners on a stove and in a gas oven are adjusted the exact same way.

I did some research and found 50+ YouTube videos on how to use it, it is still in the car parts catalogs and online forums have a bunch of threads devoted to it’s use. The only negative thing I have come across, and I must agree, having worked in the petroleum industry for 25 years, is that modern gasoline is not the same chemical soup that was gasoline from the 60’s. It still has heptanes, septanes and a cocktail of carbon atoms. But not much benzene (too carcinogenic) It has long carbon polymer chains etc. And that was before they put ethanol in it. So the question would be, is tuning to a “Bunsen Blue” color still accurate. What is a modern alternate to accurately tuning a 40 to 60 year old carburetor system?

That sounds like a good topic for a Cars and Coffee.
