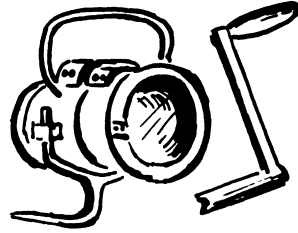
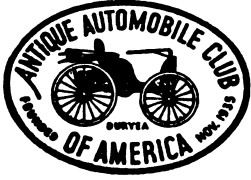

- When driving on a tour it is important that you try to keep the car behind you in your sight. This way if there is a problem the tour can stay together.

- When asked to drop out. Always stop at the side of the road. Fall back in when the tail car approaches

REPORT ON AACA SOUTHEASTERN TOUR CHAIN OF LAKES TOUR, APRIL 19-23, 2021

The trip we were anxiously waiting for had finally arrived. It had been exactly two weeks since our final covid shot and we were ready to roll. We drove to Lorton, Virginia where our 1990 Cadillac was loaded on the Amtrak auto train. The train departed at 4:00 p.m. and arrived in Sanford, Florida at 9:00 a.m. We arrived a few days early so we could do some site seeing. One of the things we saw was the Kennedy Space Center which we hadn't seen since 1989.

The tour events began Monday evening with a dessert social and drivers' meeting at the host hotel, the Mission Inn Resort in Howey-in-the-Hills, Florida.

Tuesday, we traveled through central Florida to Dade City and the home of AACA member Tommy Small. He has 20 vehicles from the 1930's through the 1970's plus 25 gas pumps, juke boxes and over 700 automotive signs. His wife has collected 1700 perfume bottles over the years. We were given a map with suggestions for lunch in Dade City. After lunch we toured the Howey Mansion. William John Howey had purchased 60,000 acres (at about \$10/acre) in Lake County Florida around 1920, founding the town that was to bear his name five years later. He planted citrus on the majority of his newly acquired acreage. Mr. Howey and his wife, Mary, completed building their home by the end of 1927. The Howey family descendants lived there until 1981. In addition to guided tours of the 7200 sq. ft., 20 room historic home, the mansion is often used for weddings and special events.

Wednesday, we embarked on a chartered tour from Lake Dora to Lake Eustis via the man-made Dora Canal. The Dora Canal was a busy waterway until the railroad came to Florida in the late 1880's. The mile and a quarter canal is virtually untouched. Some of the wildlife we were fortunate to see were alligators, eagles, turtles, snakes, herons, egrets, anhingas and wood ducks. Lunch was on our own in Mount Dora followed by shopping. An optional tour to Wekiwa Springs State Park could be taken, then back to the hotel for a pizza party around the pool.

Our stop for Thursday was to see the Gypsy Vanner Horses. On a trip to England in 1995, Dennis and Cindy Thompson of Ocala, Florida, discovered a stallion that was the height of an average horse, but built like a draft horse. The stallion had piebald (black and white) markings, an elegant head and very hairy legs. The farmer who was temporarily keeping the horse told them that a traveler owned the horse and that he also had a hidden band of mares that looked just like him. The Thompsons created the Gypsy Gold Horse Farm and in 1996 established the world's first registry for a selectively bred horse developed by British Gypsies. Our last tour was to see the wonderful private car collection of NPD (National Parts Depot), a world leader in restoration parts for older collector cars and antiques. Mr. Jim Schmidt and now his son, Rick, have been collecting cars since Jim was a young man. Jim bought a 1928 Ford Model A to restore when he was just 14 years old. He needed various nuts and bolts and then decided to make hardware kits and sell them to other Model A restorers. That was the start of NPD. Many of the cars we saw had less than 100 original miles on them. A few with less than 10 miles. All are US made.

Three regions and chapters were responsible for this amazing tour. The dinner and awards banquet were held Thursday evening and we headed for home on Friday via the auto train.
